We also met Cpl. Schmidt, the acting commander of our local RCMP detachment. He's been making an effort to visit local coffee spots and meet residents. I was honored to attend both the High School and Legion Remembrance Day services. We heard from two excellent speakers: one shared a personal account of resistance fighters in England during WWII, and the other described her visit to Canadian battle sites overseas. Their stories added a moving layer of reflection to an already meaningful day. Both services were thought-provoking and left one truly grateful for the peace that we as Canadians enjoy today.



IDEAS TO SUPPORT GRIEF DURING THE HOLIDAYS

For many grieving, the holiday season can add to the already difficult journey. The article seeks to provide a few practical ideas to support you in your journey.

- 1. Take time to reflect on the traditions you created with your loved one. Ponder which traditions you would like to continue and what traditions you may want to put a pause on for this year.
- 2. Think about the location of your holiday events. If you have historically hosted gatherings for family and friends, consider if this is something you have the capacity to do this year. Know that it is okay to reduce your workload and ask others to take over hosting.
- 3. Hold onto memories of your loved one by creating a way to remember them throughout the season. You could find a special candle to light for them or purchase a special stocking that can be hung in their memory.
- 4.If music is an important part of your holiday season, think about the type of music that you may want to fill your home with during this time. If your loved one enjoyed certain songs, you may find it comforting to spend time listening to these.
- 5.Skip or minimize gifts. Material things may seem less important to you as you grieve the loss of your loved one. Connect with your family and friends about what your preference is for gift giving this year.
- 6. Make a donation in your loved one's memory. This action might be a new tradition you can begin to keep your loved one in mind each holiday season
- 7. Ponder how much energy you have to put towards holiday activities such as decorating. If you do not feel up to decorating the way you have in the past, do not feel guilty about skipping this activity.
- 8. Allow space for your emotions. If you have a tendency of hiding your emotions, make sure you allow yourself time to process whatever is coming up for you throughout the holidays. This might be through confiding in a close friend or perhaps spending some time journalling.
- 9. If you typically find the holidays to be joyful, do not feel guilty if these feelings continue for you. Grief comes with mixed emotions, so you may experience both sadness and joy.
- 10. Accept help from others. If you have family and friends who are offering to help you out throughout this season, accept the help to lessen the load you may be navigating alone.
- 11. Attend a grief group. Spending time with others navigating their own losses can remind you that you are not alone in your journey.
- 12. Consider seeking out the support of a counsellor. Having a space to speak one on one with someone could be beneficial to your grieving process during the holiday season.

No matter how you choose to spend your holiday season, know that you will be doing your best and that this will be enough.

SNOW REMOVAL AND SANDING FOR ROADWAYS

As we prepare for the upcoming winter weather please be reminded that the Village of Kitscoty provides snow removal and ice control on municipal streets according to determined priorities. These priorities are set out in Policy PW 001 and are illustrated below.

Priority #1— village entrances and exits, Emergency routes, main School bus routes, Water Reservoir and Lift Station access;

Priority #2— Any streets not identified as Priority #1;

Priority #3— Lane ways and back alleys

No. 10-2017 a person shall remove snow and ice from any sidewalk adjacent to Property they Own or Occupy within 48 hours after the snow or ice has been deposited. A Person shall not deposit snow or ice upon any Road, Public Place or Property that is not their own.

ADDIONAL REMINDERS:

- Please refrain from crossing extension cords across sidewalks
- All curb ramps must be removed
- Please do not shovel onto village owned properties (ie: alleys and roads). The only exception of this is the Commercial areas.
- Please be mindful of Public Works when they are removing snow. Stay back 15
 ft from the equipment and do not pass while equipment is in operation.
