Be recycle ready!



How should I set out my bags for collection?

- Use see-through (clear or blue) bags for your recycling.
- Recycling bags should not exceed 20 kg (44 lb) or 184 L.
- Black garbage bags or opaque/non-see-through bags cannot be used for recycling.
- Bags should not block vehicle paths.
- During winter conditions, place your bags on a flat surface clear of any snow and ice.
- Materials that are not placed inside your bags will not be collected. Ensure all items are placed loosely inside your bags.

Recycling safety

Keep items like batteries and electronics out of your curbside recycling. Batteries can cause fires and harm workers.

There are specialized programs in Alberta to collect these items and ensure they are recycled safely.



If it lights up, beeps, buzzes or charges, it probably has a battery and doesn't belong in your household recycling.

Your recycling will be collected on

and then every second
Thursday

Please have your bags set out **by 7 a.m.**

Holidays may affect your collection schedule.

How to recycle

- ✓ Have your materials out to the curb for collection by **7 a.m.**
- ✓ Flatten cardboard to no larger than **60 x 90 cm.**
- ✓ Ensure containers are **dry, empty, and clean.**
- ✓ Remove lids from **glass containers**, leave lids on all other containers.
- ✓ Place recyclables **loose** in your bags.
- ✓ **Do not** put garbage and organics in with your recyclables.

Recycling gives materials a second life, conserves natural resources, and protects our environment for future generations.

Keep your recycling loose.

Black bags don't belong in your recycling.



Your recycling program will be managed by Circular Materials, a not-for-profit organization committed to building an efficient and effective packaging and paper recycling system across Alberta.

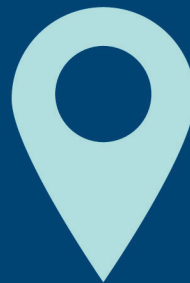
